

# The Conjoint Bachelor of Engineering with Honours and Health Science (BE(Hons)/BHSc – 675 points)

These regulations must be read in conjunction with the General Regulations for the University.

## 1. Version

- (a) These Regulations came into force on 1 January 2024.
- (b) This degree was first offered in 2024.

## 2. Variations

In exceptional circumstances the Amo Matua, P hanga | Executive Dean of Engineering or delegate, in consultation with the Te Kaupeka Oranga | Executive Dean of Health or delegate, may approve a variation of these regulations.

## 3. The structure of the qualification

To qualify for the Conjoint Bachelor of Bachelor of Engineering with Honours and Bachelor of Health Science, a student must:

- (a) be credited with a minimum of 675 points towards the qualification,
- (b) be credited with a minimum of 405 points from courses in the Bachelor of Engineering with Honours regulations; including:
  - i. at least 105 points at 100-level, consisting of courses in Schedule A and B of the Bachelor of Engineering with Honours First Year or courses approved by the Amo Matua, P hanga | Executive Dean of Engineering or delegate;
  - ii. a programme of study in an Engineering discipline with at least 300 points above 100-level approved by the Amo Matua, P hanga | Executive Dean of Engineering or delegate
  - iii. a programme of study in an Engineering discipline with at least 90 points at 400-level
  - iv. an approved academic writing test;
  - v. ENGR200 Engineering Work Experience;
- (c) be credited with courses having a minimum value of 255 points: including:
