Sentencing h pothetical R v Arnold

Arnold pleaded guilt to charges of selling methamphetamine, a Class A drug. Under the Misuse of Drugs Act 1975 the ma imum penalt for that offence is life imprisonment.

The accepted facts are that Arnold made regular, purchases of one or to grams of methamphetamine hich he then then divided into smaller quantities and sold on to other persons including his familo, associates, and on a number occasions an undercover police officer. The total amount of the drug sold over the relevant period as about 80 grams.

Arnold is 50 ears of age, has a number of lo -level prior convictions but has never been sentenced to imprisonment, he has for man ears been addicted to methamphetamine, but has since his arrest successfull undertaken treatment to help end the addiction. He is married, ith five adult children. He pleaded guilt at the first opportunit after his arrest.
